

Three Tenure-Track Positions in Environmental Studies University of Illinois at Springfield -- Illinois

Environmental Science; Three tenure-track positions; Natural Resources Policy and Administration, Sustainable Development and Environmental Health, Environmental Policy and Planning, University of Illinois at Springfield.

The Department of Environmental Studies, an interdisciplinary department in the College of Public Affairs and Administration seeks applications at the assistant professor level for three tenure-track positions (see job descriptions below). Positions include a teaching assignment of 3 courses per semester, supervision of graduate research projects and theses, and establishment of research and professional service agenda appropriate to tenure criteria. Applicants must have a Ph.D. in appropriate discipline and evidence of research potential and; or professional experience in the area(s) or related areas of teaching assignment. Professional experience and; or grant-funded research in areas related to teaching assignment and online teaching are preferred. Natural Resources Policy and Administration; Position begins January 1, 2006. Candidates must have a Ph.D. in natural resources policy and administration or related discipline. Teaching expectations include courses in the following areas; natural resources policy and administration, natural resources management, National Environmental Policy Act, environmental agriculture, core course in natural environmental sciences, research methods, and one or more of the undergraduate minor courses, including but not limited to Introduction to Environmental Studies. Sustainable Development and Environmental Health; Position begins January 1, 2006. Candidates must have a Ph.D. in sustainable development, environmental health, or related discipline.

Teaching expectations include courses in the following areas; sustainable development, environmental health policy and administration, water quality (or other media-related policy course), core courses in natural and; or social environmental sciences, research methods, and one or more undergraduate minor courses, including but not limited to environmental justice. Environmental Policy and Planning; Position begins August 15, 2006. Candidates must have a Ph.D. in environmental policy, planning and administration or related disciplines and preparation in GIS and remote sensing. Teaching expectations included courses in the following areas; environmental modeling with GIS and remote sensing; environmental policy, planning, and administration; policy analysis, geopolitics, geography, transportation, core course in environmental social sciences and humanities, and research methods. Located in the state capital, the University of Illinois at Springfield is the third campus of the University of Illinois.

The UIS campus serves over 4,000 students in 19 graduate and 20 undergraduate programs. The academic curriculum of the campus emphasizes a strong liberal arts core, an array of professional programs, extensive opportunities in experiential education, and a broad engagement in public affairs issues of the day.
